The Playground Rules

1. No student may walk across the front of the school
2. A hands off policy is in effect. A light touch is allowed during games of tag. Tag should be played between students of equally stature and age level.
3. No student may play around the portable or staff cars.
4. No students may leave the school property without the yard duty attendant's permission and supervision, i.c. to get a ball in the neighbour's yard. No student may ever go on to the road to retrieve a ball.
5. No climbing up the soccer poles, fence poles or chain-link fence around the yard.
 - a. Repercussion: sent inside to do work.
6. Bicycles may not be ridden on school property. Students should dismount at the sidewalk and walk with their bike to the rack
7. Playground equipment is for Grades K-4. Grades 5-8 may use the cement tube for a home place when playing tag. The students may no try to jump over the tube.
 - a. Repercussion: If it happens constantly they may not ride their bikes to school for a specified period of time
8. Food is allowed outside. Garbage/wrappers are to be thrown in the garbage cans at the door before they go outside.
9. No sitting on or opening the green garbage bin.
 - a. Repercussion: A reminder not to use it by the older grades.
10. Balls may only be used well away from the school building and playground equipment
 - a. Repercussion: loose their privilege to use the ball for the remainder of the recess period.
11. 11 Balls left outside after recess result in one week suspension of use of the ball.

Fighting Between Students

If you catch 2 or more students fighting you should follow these procedures:

- 1 Go over and ask both students separately what is going on.
- 2 If apologies are made and relationships restored go into the school and write up an incident in the Incident Log Book (black binder with 3 pink circles) which is in the office on the shelf

- 3 If there are serious conflicts in stores and the problem is not resolved take them into school and ask a teacher to take control. The outdoor supervisor should give the teacher what he/she saw/heard then give each student a chance to tell their side of the story. The outdoor supervisor can then return outside.
- 4 Appropriate action will be taken by the teacher and the report will be entered into the Log Book and if need be a lengthier reports will be filed in the student's file.
