Health and Welfare

Communicable Diseases

Students suffering from communicable disease (such as chicken pox, measles, pink eye, trench mouth, ringworm, scabies, pediculosis, impetigo, etc.) shall be excluded from school until they have recovered or have been granted permission to return by a physician. It is vital that these cases be reported immediately to protect other students who may have low immunity against them.

Control of pediculosis (head lice) -- see Pediculosis Head Lice-03-2006 policy

Anaphylactic Shock and Epi-pens

Some of our students may suffer from a severe allergy and need an Epi-pen within reach at all times. Students who have the potential of anaphylactic shock and who have Epi-pen kits prescribed to them by their doctor must carry this kit with them at all times during school functions.

Medications

Unless otherwise agreed upon, all student medications are to be given to the classroom teacher of your child. All medication must be clearly labeled by a pharmacist or physician to indicate the name of the student, the name of the medication, the dosage, frequency and method of administration.
