School Picture Day REMINDER

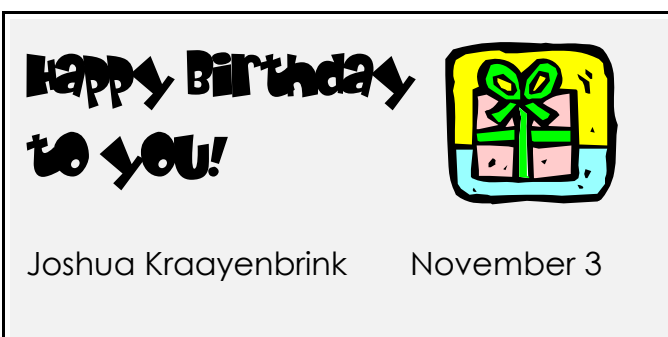
We are having school pictures taken this Wednesday, October 31. Please remember to send in your background choice with your child(ren) to hand in to the photographer. Say cheese!

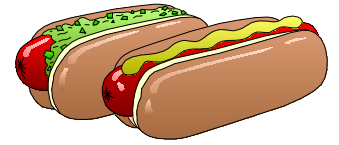
